Meeting Minutes January 2026

James Schweer called the meeting to order at 7pm. No guests were present. The Nov 2025 meeting minutes were discussed and approved as submitted.

Dave Valla reviewed the clubs' finances; He reminded everybody that 2026 dues were due. He discussed the agreement and requirements of the Wells Fargo Bank where the club checking account is. Nothing has changed and we still qualify for no service charges for the account.

John Berglund reviewed the status of the club's newsletter. Dennis Simonson has provided pictures and other information regarding the club's participation in the 2025 Veterans Day parade in Fresno. He asked members to try to send car related stories and pictures for inclusion in the newsletter. Stories about the Club are always good and may help in member recruitment.

Sheryl Hammons discussed the clubs FACEBOOK account; there is a lot of viewing and the most interest is in stories that are included on the site.

Bill Richards reviewed activities on the website. He stated that similar to the newsletter and FACEBOOK new content is always needed to keep interest in the site. Members articles are always good and help to keep the site fresh.

James asked John to review an available service regarding car show management that the club may benefit from. Car Show Pro is an online auto show management, registration, judging reporting web-based application designed to stream line and automate many of the tasks involved in hosting a car show. This service was discussed and costs reviewed. The consensus was that the service might help out in the management of our upcoming spring car show. The inclusion of the registration process was specifically discussed. It is a totally online process and provides direct feedback to the registrant including their show window placard. Motion by Bill Richards second by Dennis Baker and approved to enter into an agreement with Car Show Pro for services at our Spring 2026 Car Show.

The bathroom situation at the Clovis Bicentennial Park was discussed. The bathrooms have never been clean and ready for our car shows. Dennis Simonson discussed the use of a rental bathroom unit that has been used at other car shows. He stated the cost would be \$450 for the day of our show. He suggested that it be ordered right away if we were interested. Motion by Dean Russell second by Arnie Schweer and approved to contract with a provider in the amount of \$450 for bathroom rentals for the day of the Spring Car Show.

Club activities will now be coordinated by a committee that includes Jeannie King, Jan Bianche and Lori Sandelin. An information sheet that included some upcoming activities was distributed.

The January Ladies Luncheon will be held on Wednesday, January 28 at the Four Seasons Chinese Food Restaurant in Clovis.

Attendance Drawing was won by James Schweer. He requested that it be placed into next month's drawing. Some late discussion was held that indicated a desire that the drawing be conducted only once at the conclusion of the meeting and the amount increased every month until somebody was actually present to win. This is similar to how it was done for many years before the new way was implemented by club vote a few years ago. A motion was made but this was very late and the actual meeting appeared to be over. The subject should be discussed at a future meeting.

Since then, POCI chapters have formed all over the country and POCI Conventions have been held every year in a variety of locations. The events include a car show, tech seminars, presentations, drag racing and a great swap meet. GMC trucks were included in 1998, due to their close relation to Pontiac.

The club's magazine, *Smoke Signals*, also started in 1972 and has evolved into a world-class, award-winning monthly that continues to raise the bar for non-commercial publications. *Smoke Signals* was redesigned in 2006 and again in 2013. Today, it is a 92- to 100-page, full-color publication printed on heavyweight paper and also comes in digital form.


